### **B.** UTSSAC Report

- 1. Jabria Pittman and Ruchika Mahala attended the UTSSAC meeting in Austin on September 8-9
- 2. They are a part of the graduate and health committee for UT

- 3. Pittman: Discussions included economic transparency and career transparency; what can you do outside of your major focus. For example, if you're biomedical informatics major outside of information, what can you do? There was also a cross talk between the many campuses that UT systems have and cultural composite competency and as well as some of the policies such as the SB-17 regarding the elimination of DEI at state institutions, and SB-12, regarding student parents and pregnant students now being allowed LOA
- 4. Mahala: The meeting continued discussion around stipends not keeping up with the cost of living of the particular campus students are on. Only one campus was content with the amount of stipend they were receiving, while all others were not content. Students discussed whether a survey could be done where students can be fill out how much stipend they're getting, how much they're working, and what the cost of living is in their respective area. They are hoping to be able to bring the results of that information to the next meeting. Houston average may be publicly available online. There will be follow up to see if that information can be located.
- 5. If data cannot be located we can formulate a strategy to incorporate all the associated schools that are necessary to conduct a feasible way to conduct a survey.

- 3. Field Day/Wellness Week/Sports Day
  - Date(s) Needed

- There was a discussion to go back to having Sports/Field day be a one-day event, and no longer a week long event that was done during the peak of COVID-19. The week long event costs more than it has been worth in recent years. During COVID's peak, many people participated in the virtual events. However, last year there was a significant drop in participation. More attendees came to the in-person event, but it was limited in funding.
- The vent will go on rain or shine, and will be held in the recreation center, if it rains.
- A motion was made to vote on Sports/Field Day being a standalone event, without the virtual events. The motion was seconded. Unanimous vote in favor of Sports/Field Day being a standalone event.
- A discussion was had to decide what day to have Sports/Field day. There will be no more events in October, due to Salutation. The first weekend of November did not work for GSBS students due to programs in GSBS. The latter half of November would coincide with the holiday break/time.

  November 11<sup>th</sup> was discussed, and that day was stated by Devesh to also be Veteran's Day.
- A motion was made to vote on having Sports/Field Day on November 11<sup>th</sup>. The motion was seconded. Majority vote in favor of Sports/Field Day taking place on November 11<sup>th</sup>.
